Course: International Trade and Labor Markets

2024 FIRST SEMESTER

PROGRAM

The objective of this short course is to cover recent developments in the literature on trade and labor markets. The course should be useful to students specializing in Trade, Labor, Development or Macro. We will mostly cover empirical papers exploiting a wide range of methodologies, from differences indifferences methods to structural and quantitative studies based on equilibrium models of the labor market. By the end of the course, students will be exposed to fertile avenues of future work in this area as well as to the main methodologies that have been used in this line of work.
